BACHFEST OFFERS WURSTFEST SIDETRIP

NEW BRAUNFELS, TX – First Protestant Church, established in 1845, has teamed up with Wurstfest, to offer the first Bachfest, a concert of classical music for chorus and orchestra celebrating German heritage 8 p.m. on Nov. 8 at the church at the corner of Seguin and Coll streets.

The evening will begin at 5 p.m. with complimentary shuttle available from the church to the Wurstfest grounds. The shuttle will continue until 6:45 p.m., and return shuttle will be available from Wurstfest Gate No. 1 to the church between 6:30 and 7:30 p.m.

The concert begins at 8 p.m. at the church and will be under the direction of Dr. Joey Martin, director of the choral department at Texas State University and director of music and fine arts at First Protestant Church.

“The college chorus will be coming, and the orchestra will include faculty from Texas State University,” said Cindy Peterman, event organizer. “Gemischter Chor Harmonie also will be here performing.”

A \$10 admission ticket will include a pass to the Wurstfest festival grounds on the day of the concert, shuttle, a historical tour of the church (from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m.) and the concert.

Tickets will be available at the door and in advance at the Greater New Braunfels Chamber of Commerce, First Protestant Church Office and Sophienburg Museum. For information about Bachfest, call 609-7729.
