Visit yesteryear at Conservation Plaza, a restored German village featuring 14 structures (circa 1849-1881) furnished in the period. Ferdinand Jakob Lindheimer (1801-1879) was the “Father of Texas Botany” and the newspaper editor of the Herald-Zeitung. Lindheimer was the man most responsible for New Braunfels being located by the Comal Springs. Admission: Adults: \$2.50/Students: \$.50. **Kaffee Haus** - Open 10:30am-2pm from November 3 through November 7 and located in Conservation Plaza at 1300 Churchill Drive. Enjoy homemade German lunches and desserts. **Buckhorn Barbershop Museum** - Located at 521 West San Antonio Street - Tours upon request. Historic Outdoor Murals- Learn important elements of New Braunfels' early history through larger than life outdoor murals. (1) "City of a Prince", located at West San Antonio Street and Castell Avenue, highlights German immigration from Europe and the founding of New Braunfels. (2) "A Tribute to Ferdinand J. Lindheimer" located on the L.A. Hoffmann Building at 165 South Seguin Avenue, showcases the importance of this brilliant man. Immigrant guide, editor/publisher of the first newspaper, teacher, medicine man, botanist and considered the father of Texas botany. (3) "The Lure of the Springs" located on the Landa Park Recreation Building conveys the importance of the Comal Springs and River from prehistoric times to the industrialization of New Braunfels through today. (4) "Spass and Gemütlichkeit" located at 148 South Castell along Krause Strasse depicts German fun and fellowship with sausage, beer & wine, and bakery goods all currently in practice today.
